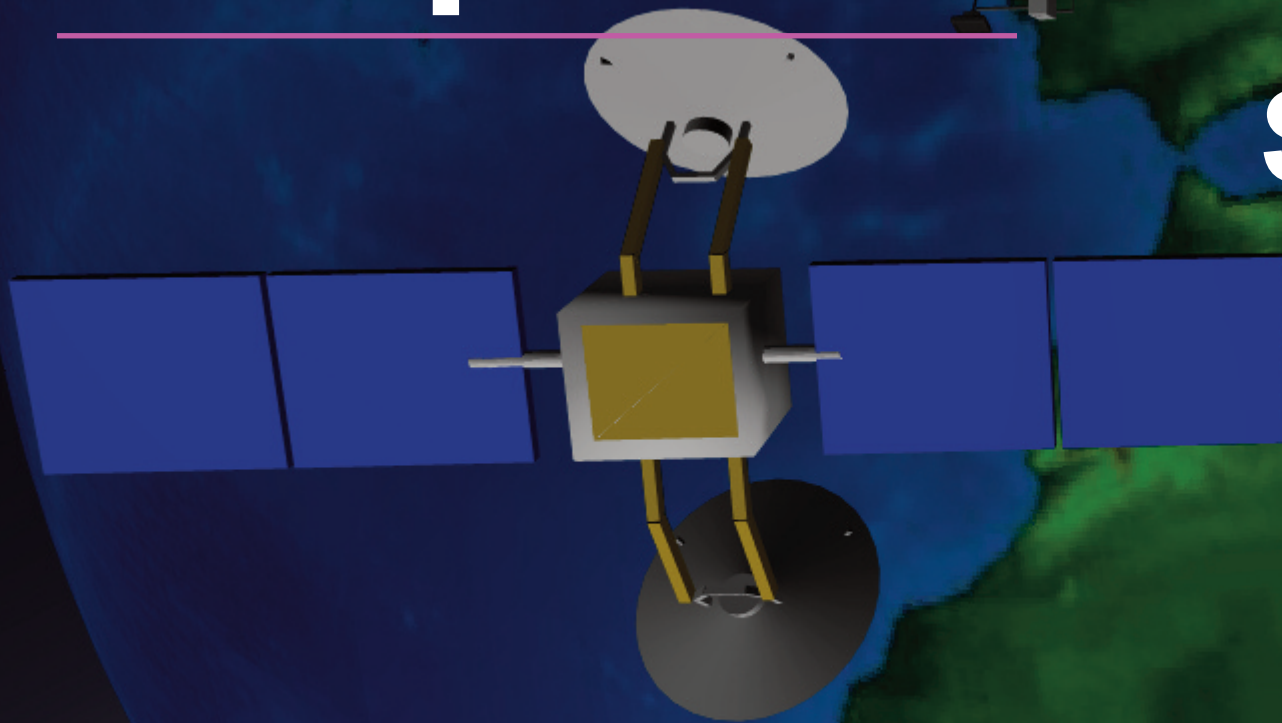

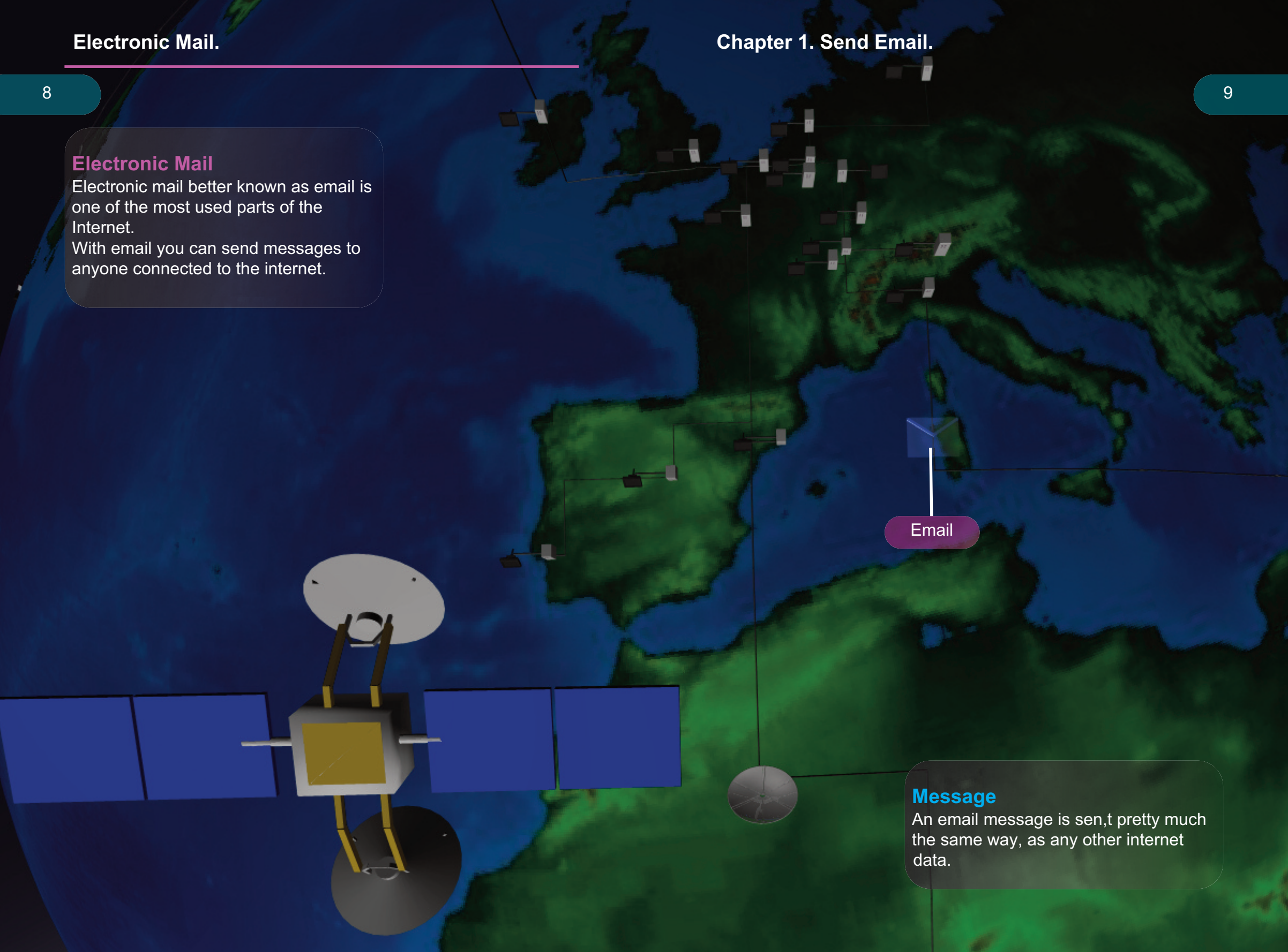

### Electronic Mail

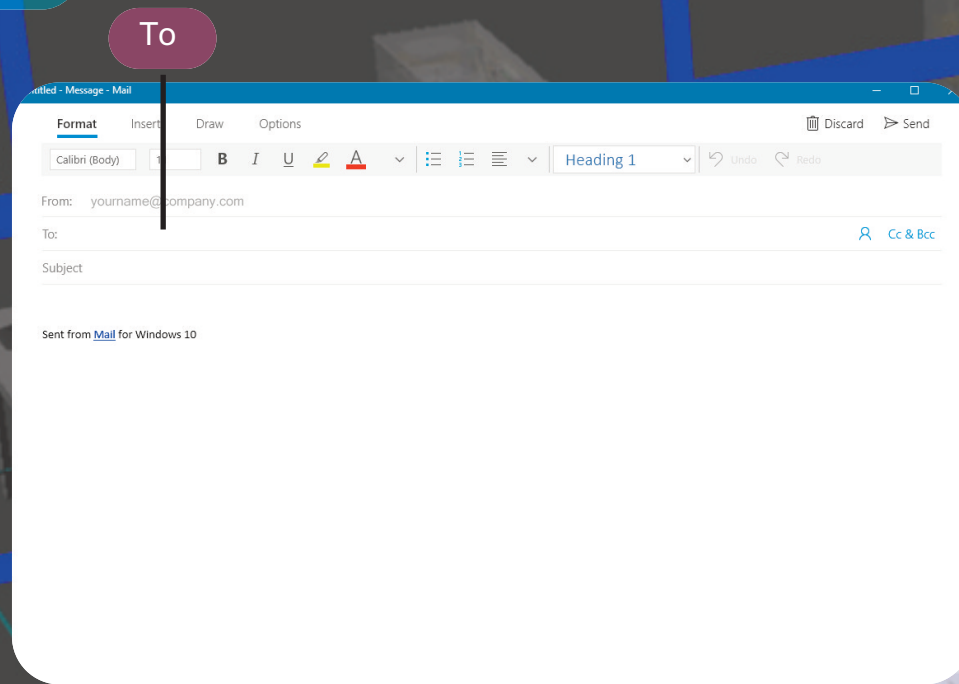
Electronic mail better known as email is one of the most used parts of the Internet. With email you can send messages to anyone connected to the internet.
